We are writing to you to obtain some information about the process involved in adopting a Palestinian child from the Occupied Territories. UPA has received many inquiries about this prospect and we have been having some difficulty finding out the exact details involved in adopting a Palestinian child.

We have learned from the United States government that parents wanting to adopt a Palestinian child must fill out a lengthy form, then take it to the U.S. consulate in Israel. We believe, however, that the Israeli government requires some information, but we are unable to determine what it is.

Can you please shed some light on the adoption of a Palestinian child?

- A) What papers are required for/from your organization?
- B) What is required by the Israeli government?
- C) Is there any cost? If so, how much?
- D) How long does to process take?
- E) Is it possible at all?


We are contacting your organization to find out the details of the adoption process, if any exist. We thought that you could give us a better idea of what requirements need to be
